Sessions 1-5: An Introduction to Values and Careers

Timings:

40 to 50 minutes

Group size:

Up to 30 students but smaller groups allow for more personalised discussion

Age range:

11-18 (using the support and challenge options as required)

unboxd lesson plans are based on the 5Es instructional model based on the constructivist approach to learning (see Bybee et al. 'The BSCS 5E instructional model and 21st century skills' (2009)), which says that learners build and construct new ideas on top of their prior learning. Ultimately, students begin to think of learning as accumulated, evolving knowledge which is particularly useful as students build knowledge and understanding of values and begin to consider their relationship to careers.
